Principal's Report: Edwina Thompson

Competency A: Champions teachers and staff excellence through a focus on continuous improvement to develop and achieve the vision of high expectations for all students.

- The Director of Curriculum and Instruction has been working with other teachers in Critical Friends
  Groups (CFGs) to discuss formative assessments. Teachers meet to discuss instruction and their
  concerns; best practices are shared, and staff are invited to observe their instruction. Staff members
  follow these observations with additional discussion to address the teacher's concerns as well as to share
  other resources to ensure differentiation, equitable practices, and student learning.
- Our building is continuing with equity professional development. Our focus for this month is finishing
  up grading for equity pd and discussing student viewpoints on this year's policies related to retakes and
  the failure floor.
- The Omega Staff is meeting to evaluate the year and plan the next steps to improving on the program
- Clinician Conversations: Lane Tech clinicians will co-facilitate conversation with staff to discuss various mental health topics and how to identify and mitigate
- · Spring sports teams continue their success bringing home wins and individual/team achievements
- The Attendance Office sent out early warning notifications to alert teachers of student 'cuts' to class, and have asked teachers to initiate conversations with students and families around the importance of consistent class attendance.
- Building operations is overseeing a project to add a 570k+ technology upgrade to 100 classrooms to improve teaching ability. This is a continuation of a 2nd round of installs that started with 47 classrooms from the 2020-2021 SY
- Building operations is overseeing a ceramics classroom relocation to give additional storage and learning environment
- Building operations is overseeing a new weight room install to give additional space for PE and Athletics for physical development
- The Grading for Equity team is working on their 4th Professional Development presentation; we are currently examining the change of GPAs over time as we have implemented more equitable grading practices and will be focusing on the positive work being done across our building
- Students of the Quarter Awards are provided for our Lane Tech Academic Center students
- Lane Tech Academic Center teachers participate in weekly 7th and 8th grade team meetings to discuss instruction
- The Athletic Department sends twice weekly Lane Tech Sports Update for staff, students, and parents celebrating successes on and off the field.

#### Competency B: Creates powerful professional learning systems to guarantee learning for all students.

- The student advisory committee developed a presentation on LGBTQ+
- The Director of Curriculum and Instruction is working with the GFE team to finalize our final PD, focused on the benefits our equitable grading practices have had on our students (with a specific focus on student voice)
- The GSA created an advisory presentation to educate students and staff on the LGBTQ+ community.
- The Director of Curriculum and Instruction collaborated with department chairs and Principal Thompson to discuss the creation of a Retake Center, where students could retake summative assessments and students who need additional time per their IEP or 504 plan could also test. Teachers would grant students an opportunity to retake their assessment, students would sign up for one of two dates, and this would automatically notify me, the teacher, and our volunteers of the students' attendance.
- Administrators attended AP:Preparate Conference in New York City and AP: A Dream Deferred in Washington D.C. to collaborate with educators and administrators across the country to expand access and equity for our students across Advanced Placement offerings.
- The Director of Curriculum and Instruction collaborated with Jeff Solin, Laura McLaughlin-Kantowicz,
  Jackie Gilson, and Kyle Perfect to plan a second round of Skills Strengthening Sessions. Students will be
  able to choose from sessions that help them become more organized electronically (Gmail and Drive),
  deal with stress in a healthy manner, how to manage time efficiently, and how to annotate.
- · Teacher Assistants and Senior Leaders are tutoring for writing center
- Omega Student Council is planning Omega Workshops on Altruistic Activism and the Omega Humanities Festival.
- Our staff members have submitted over 2100 Aspen Journal entries entered for family outreach and student engagement since the beginning of the year.
- The Instructional Leadership Team continues in the instructional cycle on how to best support teachers in instruction via formative assessments and peer coaching conversations. They are having one on one conversations with students.
- The food pantry supports those students that may have food insecurities. Creating a system that allows every student to visit the pantry allows us to support those who may be in need. Addressing food insecurity will allow students to focus on their education during instructional time.

# Competency C: Builds a culture focused on College and Career readiness-develops the full range of students' learning capacities, creative, social-emotional, behavioral and physical.

- The Director of Admissions will begin programming incoming students: placing students in courses they select as much as possible to meet their interests
- Student support groups are in full swing. There is a support group for almost every grade level approximately 70 students are being served.
- LTAC 7th grade academic advisory courses are focusing on kindness and being an upstander
- The social worker will continue to share mental health activities & resources through LT's social media platform

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- Of the 17 Alpha students who presented at the City Science Fair, 10 students will be invited to present
  their papers and/or presentations at the IJAS state science fair in Peoria, IL. Their projects will be
  presented to a much bigger pool of STEM professional judges. Awards will be announced on 4/2
- The Athletic Department is planning a Career in Sports Day with different professionals in the industry to present to our Sports Communications classes that promote Lane Tech Athletics
- Our Friends of Lane is supporting a 350k sound system upgrade for the Lane Auditorium
- At least 58 seniors (primarily students who qualify for free lunch) attended our financial aid review day, during which students met 1:1 and in small groups with members of CPS' OSCPA team to review their financial aid packages. On a scale of 1 to 10 students rated this as a 9.08 in terms of helpfulness.
- 96.81% of Lane Tech seniors have met the graduation financial aid graduation requirement by completing the FAFSA or Alternative App or completing the waiver process (some waivers are still in processing).
- The Director of Grading and Assessment organized and administered the PSAT exam to 1987 students on 4/19
- The Director of Grading and Assessment organized and will be administering the make-up exams for both SAT and PSAT to our students on April 26th and 27th, respectively.
- The Director of Grading and Assessment is continuing the administration of the ISA (Illinois Science Assessment) to all 11th grade students during, both in early-April and in late-April.
- AP exams have arrived! AP testing will begin on 5/2-5/13 with make-up exams being administered 5/17-5/20!
- The Director of Curriculum and Instruction is planning an end of year Skills Session for College Essay
  Writing, maintaining friendships throughout the summer, Thinking About College, and Sessions in Art
  and Music. To this end, she has been collaborating with the junior and senior English teachers to better
  understand what areas our college essay session could target, and has been communicating with Mr.
  Ceh regarding art.
- On April 29, Lane Tech counselors will host our annual celebration of Decision Day with field games, raffles, and prizes to help our students get ready for college experiences across
- 7 of the competing Alpha students won the Outstanding Gold Award for exhibitions and all are moving forward to the IJAS State Science Fair in Peoria, IL on April 22-23. One additional 8th grader will have their paper submitted for consideration in the science fair. The details are outlined in our daily news.
- The Director of Culture and Climate is working with peer conference students to teach effective communication and conflict resolution skills.
- The BIPOC Committee educates and empowers students in using their voice for positive cultural change.
- The Attendance Team is utilizing their Mental Health Day Absence Tracking System to streamline communication from families when students accrue multiple mental health absences.

Competency D: Empowers and motivates families and the community to become engaged.

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- Lane Tech partnered with Northwestern University for a second Teen Wellness Parent Speaker Series parent presentation. The Topic was Signs of Depression in Teens, \*Over 80 people participated
- The Director of Culture and Climate partnered with the Lane Tech Alumni Association to First time host a prom pop-up shop. Lane collected gently used and new prom items.
- The Omega Staff presented at the Lane Tech Meet & Greet for the prospective freshmen and answered questions about the Omega program.
- Lane Tech Guitar classes hosted our annual spring concert on April 20 given by our students and their teachers.
- The Admissions Office is hosting trivia night for incoming students on 5/12
- The Admissions Office is hosting a Math exam on 6/4, language placement on 5/7, and music auditions on 5/3 and 5/4- all opportunities for families to start to meet teachers and engage with the school
- Freshmen Connections is planned for June.
- Our Athletic Director is promoting our Lane Tech Athletics Youth Summer Camps within the community
- New This Summer: Lane Tech is planning to offer a summer enrichment program with classes in creative writing, computer programming, Spanish and French, drama, robotics, summer lawn games, and beginning yoga.
- New This Summer: Lane Tech athletics is offering an array of sports camps in boys basketball, girls basketball, and soccer... to name a few... this summer through their booster clubs.
- The Attendance Office initiated a Fast Track Prom Attendance Initiative for students who have fallen behind with attendance year-to-date.
- The Attendance Office staff utilizes a bi-weekly Attendance Bulletin alerting students and parents of unexcused absences that could cause demerits
- 238k GYM 1 seating upgrade and enhancement to enhance our physical environment
- LTAC Student Council hosted a collection drive for New Hope Food Pantry
- Lane hosted the National Junior Honor Society Induction Ceremony for LTAC parents and new inductees
- The Director of Grading and Assessment created a Student PSAT Launchpad for families and students to reference for information and FAQs
- Teen Wellness Parent Speaker Series continued- April Topic: Depression among Teens
- The Alpha Stem Coordinator presented at the Lane Tech Meet & Greet for the prospective freshmen and answered questions about the Alpha program. Alpha teachers and Alpha students participated.
- Lane's Office of Culture and Climate hosted a food drive that engaged the LT student and parent, and community.
- The Attendance Office developed a bi-weekly attendance bulletin to alert families and teachers of unexcused absences accrued within the past month to increase support for students
- Principal Thompson meets monthly with the Friends of Lane to engage with parents about our school's process. This month, Assistant Principal Sarah Hanly led the behind the scenes tour for families.
- Principal Thompson submits weekly communications to parents, staff and students to update them about Lane's accomplishments and policy information
- Staff and community partners are creating opportunities to address supportive events for all of our students. A prom dress is currently underway for students who would like to participate.
- The Attendance Office is hosting a Fast Track Prom Attendance Initiative for students who have fallen behind with attendance year-to-date.

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Competency E: Relentlessly pursues self-disciplined thinking and action supports a climate that values, accepts, and understands diversity in culture and point of view.

- The LTAC students took a field trip to Illinois Holocaust Museum
- Cross-curricular units in history and English (human rights/ Night by Elie Wiesel) begins
- The Director of Curriculum and Instruction continues to work with teachers from the English, Sciences, Math, and World Language Departments in preparation of holding PD on the culturally relevant instruction. We held our first meeting in the Art Department. After meeting and preparing with Sarah Wain, they presented on this topic and have shared resources with their teachers. They are also looking to follow up on a second meeting date to discuss how the resources we've shared are being utilized and to what effect.
- The GSA collaborated with staff and student leaders to present ways to support and educate students about the LGBTQ+ community
- Lane's symbol committee consists of staff and students who will be making a recommendation for a new symbol. They have collected the results from the first survey and will be opening the second survey for students soon.
- The Culture and Climate Department completed focus groups for SEL
- The Principal Discretion Process is complete and we submitted names for all 56 seats.
- Principal Thompson meets quarterly with various representatives from student leadership to hear what is going well and where we need to improve.
- The Behavioral Health Team continues to meet weekly to review referrals and support individual student needs
- Our Equity Policy Team launched a dress code survey for students and staff to solicit feedback and they have received more than 1400 responses.
