The new Continuous Work Improvement Plan cycle will be in the spring of 2023
ECCC - Early College Career Credentials
- b. PPLC - Rebecca Daly and Mario Nunez
Researching the Block Schedule, but are not committed to selecting the block schedule for next year.
There's no vote and the PPLC does not have the authority to select the Block Schedule. PPLC makes a recommendation of the feedback from the staff.
Staff survey says 70% are interested in *hearing more* about the schedule, but to say it is not in favor.
Planning on presenting findings from both teacher and student surveys to the staff on December 23; as well as a sample block schedule with frequently asked questions.
Again, there are no plans in the immediate future for Block Schedule. Still in the investigative stage.
Research indicates no conclusive evidence that the Block Schedule has an academic impact.
Survey results will be presented at the next LSC meeting.

This takes time - a huge shift in the instructional process and professional learning. At the informal Tea Time with Principal Thompson, the students expressed mixed feelings regarding the Block Schedule.

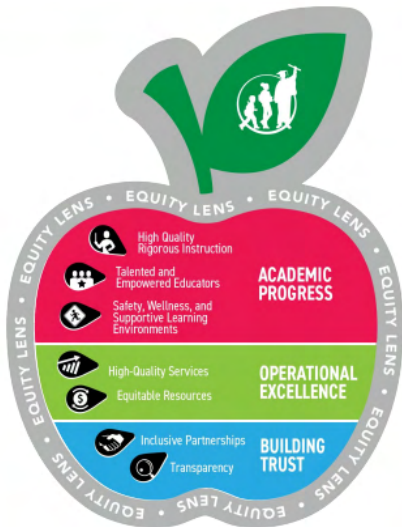

- In SY22, **81.36%** of Lane students passed an AP exam with a **3** or higher, which is the **highest pass rate in Lane's history**.



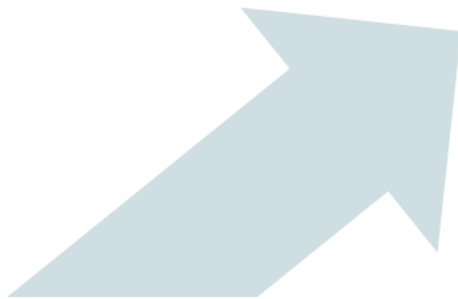

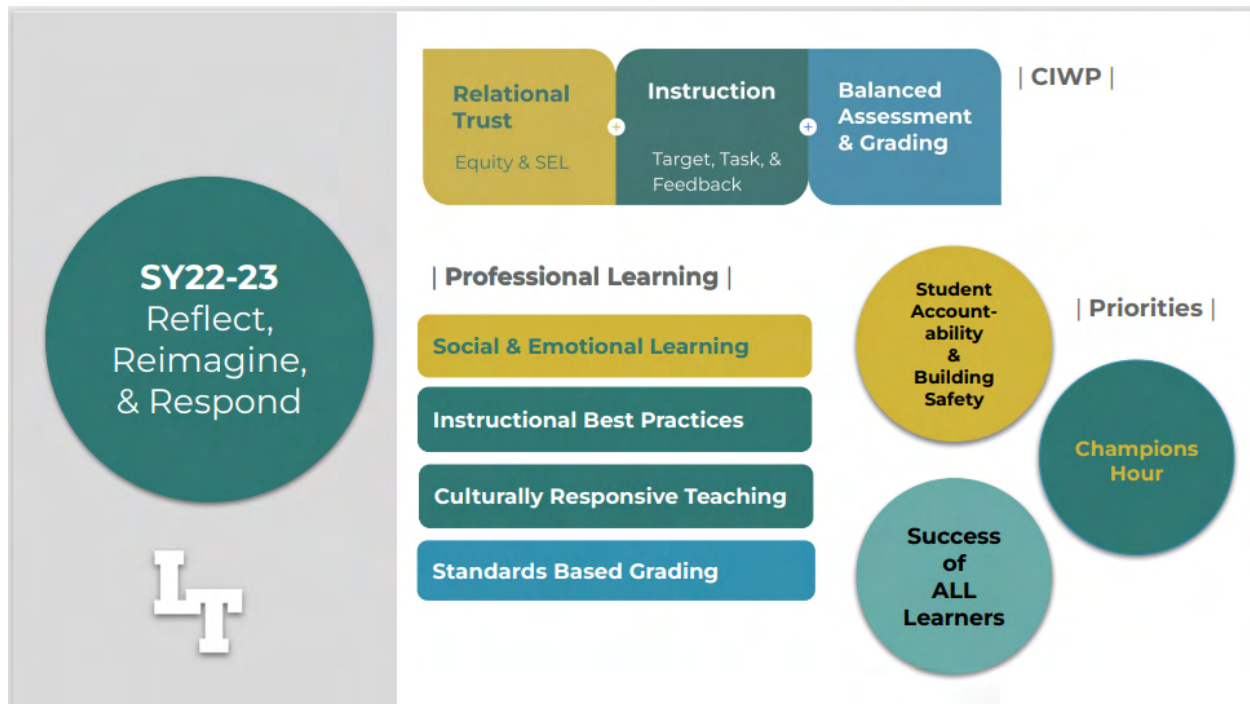

- **75.6% of Lane** students are enrolled in an AP course (SY23).
- Lane students have registered for **6,582** exams this year (SY23)
- **3,446** students are taking an exam, meaning most students are taking multiple AP exams (SY23)
