a. Principal - Edwina Thompson (see attached)

Thank you for being so flexible during last week's evacuation. A student saw something in the bathroom and informed the school. The district directed to evacuate the school and, they will give an update. Mercury was found, they mitigated the situation, worked through the night and took care of areas that need more mitigation to ensure the safety of the school.

Principal Thompson would like to thank Assistant Principals Kerri Thompson, Molly Hart, Sarah Hanly, and Joshua Dresser for their diligence to work on a contingency plan as the district determines the next step.

Competency A: Champions teachers and staff excellence through a focus on continuous improvement to develop and achieve the vision of high expectations for all students.

- Freshman Off Track students (9) (January) will be meeting with their teachers, administrators and counselors this month to discuss additional supports, and getting back on track
- Sophomore Off Track (28 students) (January) information will be reviewed and discussed with their teachers, administrators and counselors; students may be recommended for academic academy, or other supports with counseling department
- Students completed final exams in late December and were given opportunities for final grade recovery.
- Students have collectively removed over 5000 demerits using our weekly goal setting form for perfect attendance.
- Staff and students lead monthly social and emotional advisory lessons to bring awareness to a variety of student identified topics.
- Building operations is preparing for furniture investment in the classroom for teachers and students and evaluating proposed camera updates for additional locations.
- Assistant Principals continue to administer non-evaluative walkthroughs of all classes to offer positive feedback for instruction and the classroom environment
- All spring sports are utilizing hallways, weight rooms and free gyms for pre-season workouts
- The Instructional leadership team meets bi-weekly to examine data and produce professional learning for staff within the building.
- LTAC 7th and 8th Grade teachers meet weekly to collaborate on students, assignments, and big due
  dates.
- Latin Student organization is hosting workshops for Latinx students to help them with programming and college searches

#### Competency B: Creates powerful professional learning systems to guarantee learning for all students.

- The Standards Based Grading committee is meeting Jan. 17th to continue looking at standards and looking at current standards/practices being used in current SBG classrooms.
- Administrator and teacher leaders wrapped up first semester PLC sessions around SEL, Instruction, and Culturally Responsive Teaching. Staff will begin a different session of their course team's choosing starting the last week of January.

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- The administration provided professional development to Department Chairs
  and Lead Teachers focused on the area of high quality and effective teams.
- Counselors, Social Workers and Psychologists continue to run small groups for our students this month that meet once a month for 8-10 weeks.
- The Behavioral Health Team continues to review all referrals and works to provide suggestions to teachers, and support students who need more than classroom supports through counselor and SW meetings
- The Director of Assessment and Grading is supervising the High School & Beyond survey (Longitudinal Study) for ~40 randomly selected Freshman students on 1/24/23.
- The cluster program (students with high incidence needs) ran a store with merchandise made by our students during the month of December- the Around the Corner Cafe! Students continue to sell coffee and other items daily as part of their skills program.
- The Latin Student organization is hosting workshops for Latinx students to help them with
   programming and college searches
- The Black Student Association created a display to celebrate Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
- Course teams engaged in professional collaboration about student work and meaningful grading, grading categories, homework, resubmission policies, and retake policies.
- Course teams engaged in professional conversations around unit planning, common tasks and assessments, and year long scope and sequence.

## Competency C: Builds a culture focused on College and Career readiness-develops the full range of students' learning capacities, creative, social-emotional, behavioral and physical.

- The College and Career Coach hosted our Alumni Fair this month for current juniors and seniors. 156 students registered to meet with alumni from 38 colleges. Additionally, we will offer a virtual alumni panel during Champion Hour this Friday with six recent alumni from across the country.
- The social workers and counselors are hosting eight social emotional groups since December. In
  addition, there is a Trauma group called SPARCS that will begin this month.
- The annual College Night Fair will be on March 23rd. Currently, 58 colleges have confirmed that they
  will attend.
- The College and Career Center is hosting presentations by Chicago Scholars and University of Chicago Collegiate Scholars this month. Additionally, we are hosting a presentation on college search considerations for the LGBTQ+ Community.
- College Application Update:
  - 92.34% of all non-cluster seniors have applied to at least one college. 86.92% of non-cluster seniors have applied to a match or reach school as defined by University of Chicago. 82.17% of non-cluster seniors have applied to 3+ colleges. 87.79% of non-cluster seniors have completed the financial aid graduation requirement (we're waiting on some waivers to go through; this number is likely an undercount).
- Our Community Relations Director Amber Loving hosted a Vision Board Worksop to help students set and recognize their goals for the year of 2023. This workshop was planned through the LT Mentorship Program, but all students who were interested were invited to attend. 20 students signed up to attend and the majority of them attended with their peer mentor or mentee.

#### EDWINA THOMPSON

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Case managers and Admissions Director submitted over 150 new requests to the College Board for testing accommodations.

- The Director of Assessment and Grading organized the 'teacher' assignments and schedules for SAT Prep. She is organizing/creating content for a meeting with all teachers regarding expectations and questions/concerns. SAT Prep Session 1 will begin Jan. 30th.
- The Director of Assessment and Grading organized the Elective Fair for rising sophomores students, which will take place after school on 2/14/23.
- The Director of Assessment and Grading is preparing for the Seal of Biliteracy Exam and which students will be invited to take part.
- The Director of Assessment and Grading is organizing various data points comparing previous P/SAT scores for teachers to help empower their students and tailor their instruction to the emergent needs of their students.
- Parents receive a Thursday College Newsletter- upcoming college events, internships, recommendations and tips for college/career search.

#### Competency D: Empowers and motivates families and the community to become engaged.

- Director of Culture and Climate and the Community Relations Representative are meeting with local businesses to bridge relations between Lane and the Roscoe Village community
- The Alpha Science Fair took place in December and there are 10 finalists. Participants are being
  recognized within our local and district community.
- Social Worker Ms. McLaughlin-Kantowicz requested a speaker from Northwestern to offer their insights for parents of athletes. The Athletic Director and Mrs. McLaughlin- Kantowicz partnered with the representative to develop a sports and mental health presentation for families.
- Administrators met with representatives from Depaul college Prep and the 47th Ward Office to discuss safety at Clark Park and near our campuses.
- Extracurricular, sports, and academic programs are hosting senior nights to honor the work our seniors have done over the course of the past four years.
- Social Emotional resources shared through parent's corner on Counseling website
- The Director of Culture and Climate partnered with our Alumni Association to provide winter wear for families in need.
- The College and Career Coach connected with alumni who are attending various universities to gain
  insight into their on-campus experiences. She visited campuses and met with them individually.
- All communication with students regarding Skills Strengthening Sessions and SAT Prep has been sent to families.
- All families received SAT Prep, PSAT, and Khan Academy information and have been encouraged to enroll their children for our enrichment programs.
- Assistant Principal Alison Hildebrandt will present to Friends of Lane about the Course Registration Process on January 18th.
- Our school store is designed to support our school with 100% of all proceeds
- Lane families volunteer with their child's booster club to volunteer at home games: swim, boys and girls basketball, and wrestling.

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- Lane Tech Basketball hosted its Alumni Night and partnered with the Alumni Association
- Parents of students with between 5-10 absences so far this year were sent a letter from the school
  reminding families of the importance of attendance.
- The Director of Culture and Climate circulates a monthly newsletter that is provided to staff, students
  and families. It highlights the monthly celebrations taking place at Lane and offers resources for
  students as it relates to their culture and awareness.
- The College and Career Coach hosted drop in hours for college application assistance during the holiday break.
- Lane Tech mental health resources shared with students and families through various methodsstudent news, counseling website
- Principal Thompson meets monthly with the Friends of Lane to address parent questions and provide updates about the school.
- College Representative visits from national and international colleges will continue throughout December and January; visit lantech.org/ccc for the full calendar.
- The LTAC Director and administrators host monthly LTAC parent meetings.

### Competency E: Relentlessly pursues self-disciplined thinking and action supports a climate that values, accepts, and understands diversity in culture and point of view.

- Principal Thompson received a \$12,000 grant as a member of the Transforming Bias-based Harm Hub for administrators. This grant will find an in-house project that helps to encourage accountability, belonging, and consent.
- The Director of Culture and Climate is organizing and planning our second semester culture and climate student focus groups
- The Director of Culture and Climate collaborates with student leaders and staff to develop student advisory lessons center on cultural awareness, diversity, and acceptance.
- Student leader athletes collaborate to produce weekly IHSA communication for the Lane community.
- Our leaders continue to prepare professional learning that centers around building relationships and community through equitable differentiation.
- Lane's Girls Basketball Team celebrates National Women in Sports Day January 14, 2023 by hosting a women's basketball shootout with multiple schools competing in an all day event
- Director of Culture and Climate Gabriela Escobar is actively working with focus groups ,peer conference, advisory, and BIPOC committees to provide services for our students.
- Director of Assessment and Grading Katherine Gomez is reviewing grades for all students with IEPs, making S2 program changes for upperclassmen as needed.
- Student voice committees meet once per month with administration or leadership team members to share thoughts and seek solutions.

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Facilities Updates :

#### HVAC Update ( Construction Begins Summer 2023 and Ends Winter 2023 )

The FY2023 CPS Capital Plan includes projects across the city that focus on priority facility needs at neighborhood schools in five main areas: critical facility needs, interior improvements, programmatic investments, site improvements, and IT and security upgrades.

Lane Tech High School was identified as a facility requiring a renovation to address critical facility needs. The FY23 project will target the mechanical systems which control the indoor environment and air quality of the building.

The scope of the project includes modernization efforts targeting the mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems for the facility. The project will enhance the high-quality learning environment within the building and improve the functionality of the systems. Exact details will not be determined until the budget and program are approved by the CPS Board of Education.

Design will be completed early winter 2023 with construction scheduled to begin summer 2023.

Lane will receive a parking lot update that goes from Western Ave. to Stadium Drive.



- The purpose: the gage faculty and staff interest in learning more about possible block scheduling here at Lane
- Survey Breakdown
- Key takeaways
  - Over 60% interested in learning more with more than 50% of faculty and staff responding
  - Some common concerns
    - Subject dependent
      - The impact on a math class may look different than a history class
    - Adolescent attention spans
      - Adolescent brains may have a hard time focusing for long periods of time, if the time is not structured to provide breaks


# Overview of Student Surveys


- Plurality of responses saying "Yes"


Would you like to see Lane implement a block schedule for the 2023-2024 school year? (without seniors)




