## 2023 LSC Teacher Survey for Principal Evaluation - Rebecca Daly

110 teachers and staff filled out the surveys. Approximately 87% were from teachers or support roles.

Recommend the school: 72% of teachers scored 9 or 10, and 94% of teachers scored 7 or higher.

Recommend employment: 97% of staff 7 or higher.

There were concerns regarding email and privacy, and a second one removed the email request. Kept it open until late today. Teacher reps promised not to share with student members their information, therefore it took a while for the results to come in.

Mission and vision: Appropriate Curriculum and Instructional Supplies: the scores were exceedingly positive.

- ➤ Of particular interest, is the 'Support For You To Be Successful' category results: outstanding and above 86%.
- ➤ 'Response To Your Needs': 83% outstanding and above.
- > These two categories were important to teachers.

Principal's performance, very high marks across the board. Does the principal evaluate you? - There was confusion on how to answer that question directly. For example, I'm evaluated by my AP. The administrative team questionnaire gave us the best picture. Remove the word 'evaluate?'

Notes for comments: there were many positive remarks but the overall concern for teachers - managing students' cell phone use.

### c. T-Mobile Cell tower approval (update)

The LSC voted to approve the principal to sign the contract for the cell tower usage for 32k. The district advocated for LT because of the T-mobile execution of the process. Therefore Lane Tech will get a total of 52k one-time payment, for the fiscal year 2024. Note: the school has been saving that money over the years. Saved over time, \$162 and we will use those funds for emergency situations (i.e. emergency bus cards, sports travel.)
