Competency A: Champions teachers and staff excellence through a focus on continuous improvement to develop and achieve the vision of high expectations for all students.

- The CCC hosted our University of Chicago college rep for a meeting with teachers regarding concise and effective recommendation letter writing.
- Department Chairs continue to collaborate on a new tool to review and assess units of instruction.
- We are hosting our last module of professional learning. Staff have all completed two sessions for this semester: formative assessment, social-emotional learning, or culturally responsive teaching.
- Incoming 9th grade students allowed to select AP HuG vs World Studies - about 55% selecting AP
- Final acceptances for incoming 9th graders is this Friday. So far, 981 students have accepted their seats.
- 2568 Q3 letters will be sent out informing parents of their students' attendance percentage, YTD absences and Q3 absences.
- Freshmen and sophomores who are off track will continue meeting with their teachers, administrators and counselors this month to discuss additional supports, and getting back on track.
- Students continue to utilize the Wellness Center to practice a constructive coping strategy when they are feeling stressed, anxious, etc. We are creating posters to be put around the building to advertise the services.
- Air conditioning is now on in all classrooms and offices.
- Students in grades 7-12 are now participating in the spring sports season.
- Assistant Principals continue to administer non-evaluative walkthroughs of all classes to offer positive feedback for instruction and the classroom environment
- The Instructional leadership team meets bi-weekly to examine data and produce professional learning for staff within the building.
- LTAC 7th and 8th Grade teachers meet weekly to collaborate on students, assignments, and big due dates.

Competency B: Creates powerful professional learning systems to guarantee learning for all students.

- Over 300 out of school time programs, activities, and events have taken place during the SY23 year.
- Counselors, social workers and psychologists continue to run small groups for our students this month that meet once a month for 8-10 weeks.
- Over 300 9th and 10th graders will receive testing accommodations to support their respective diverse learning needs on the PSAT.

EDWINA THOMPSON

Principal

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- Approximately 110 Juniors received testing accommodations to support their respective diverse learning needs on the SAT.
- Case managers will host IEP writing workshops for special education teachers focused on aligning IEP goals with stated standards.
- Our Admissions Director is conducting group and individual meetings with incoming students with IEPs to determine the best fit for courses.
- The Behavioral Health Team continues to review all referrals and works to provide suggestions to teachers, and support students who need additional assistance through counselor and SW meetings.
- Course teams engage in professional collaboration about student work and meaningful grading, grading categories, homework, resubmission policies, and retake policies.
- Course teams engage in professional conversations around unit planning, common tasks and assessments, and year long scope and sequence.
- All programming for current students is complete; we are building the master schedule.
- LTAC students attended a day of service field trips and visited the Illinois Holocaust Museum.

Competency C: Builds a culture focused on College and Career readiness-develops the full range of students' learning capacities, creative, social-emotional, behavioral and physical.

- The Black Student Association hosted their ninth annual Historical Black Colleges and University Tour to Nashville, TN; Atlanta, GA; Tuskegee, AL; and Montgomery, AL.
- Our Director of Admissions will begin programming incoming students: placing students in courses they select as much as possible to meet their interests.
- DL teachers met with 64 incoming students with IEPs to determine course selections for 9th grade.
- Our Director of Admissions has begun collecting College Board accommodations forms for students with IEPs and 504s.
- The Gender and Sexualities Alliance will be recognizing a day of silence on April 14, 2023.
- 10 students attended Wright College to explore alternative options for career paths. Students were educated about community college and transitions into 4 year universities.
- Our School Community Rep and Director of Culture and Climate are planning a Meet & Greet Brunch for female students who signed up for EmpowerHER.
- Our School Community Rep is organizing and collecting Summer Enrichment Programs to be prepared and entered in ASPEN. There are currently 20 enrichment programs being offered this summer for students that fall under a variety of categories such as sports and recreation, world language, STEM, and fine and performing arts.
- Over 200 9th and 10th graders received testing accommodations to support their respective diverse learning needs on the PSAT.

 - Seal of Biliteracy (last day) - 4/14 - testing ~260 students

 - Algebra Exit Exam (4/19) - testing 126 students

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- Parents receive a Thursday College Newsletter- upcoming college events, internships, recommendations and tips for college/career search.
- Our CCC Coach took 48 juniors to UIUC, Washington University in St. Louis, and Saint Louis University.
- 23.72% of Juniors have been on a CCC hosted college/ career field trip, attended a presentation by a college rep or college/ career focused organization, or participated in a Lunch with a Professional.
- 30 juniors attended IIT's Engineering Day.
- Ms. Bantz is planning a trip to both Northwestern and University of Chicago for students with weighted GPAs above 4.9.
- Student Council Elections are upon us and close to 50 students are running for officer positions.
- Senior Check Out and Decision Day are April 28, 2023 and our counseling staff will be hosting various events in the stadium on April 28.

Competency D: Empowers and motivates families and the community to become engaged.

- Parent volunteers have assisted with preparation for April's student events - Prom Dress Drive, Decision Day, etc.
- 10 female students attended the Young Women of Color symposium which consists of workshops and lectures.
- Preparation for Champions Week, formerly known as Freshmen Connections, is underway; we look forward to welcoming our incoming freshmen.
- Our Cluster teachers hosted a Unified Lane Buddies Talent Show and we had Audubon pre-schoolers attend the show as well as families.
- Lane is partnering with the Friends of Lane to emphasize the importance of their annual Gala.
- Parents and students receive weekly emails notifying them of the number of tardies their students have received all year and the total accumulated the week before the email is sent.
- Our Director of Culture and Climate is organizing donations and day of operations for our Prom Pop Up Shop.
- Our School Community Representative is planning a Summer Involvement Fair for students to explore summer opportunities for learning and internship opportunities.
- Our LTAC Director holds a monthly parent meeting with 7th and 8th grade parents.
- Progress reports are due by 5 pm Wednesday (4/26); these will be printed and handed out during Adv. on Friday 4/28.
- Mrs. McLaughlin-Kantowicz will attend CPS's first Mental Health Summit with the Student Wellness Ambassador team, as well as other Lane Tech students. The summit is May 6, 2023 at Malcolm X College.
- There are social emotional resources shared through the Parent's Corner on the Counseling website
- Our school store is designed to support our school with 100% of all proceeds.
- Lane families volunteer with their child's booster club to volunteer at home games: swim, boys and girls basketball, and wrestling.
- The Director of Culture and Climate circulates a monthly newsletter that is provided to staff, students and families. It highlights the monthly celebrations taking place at Lane and offers resources for students as it relates to their culture and awareness.
- Lane Tech shares mental health resources with students and families through various methods- student news, counseling website

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- Principal Thompson meets monthly with the Friends of Lane to address parent questions and provide updates about the school.

Competency E: Relentlessly pursues self-disciplined thinking and action supports a climate that values, accepts, and understands diversity in culture and point of view.

- Dr. Hanly and Assistant Principal Ara met with the student bathroom safety committee to discuss inclusive actions to support student bathroom safety and usage.
- Principal Thompson, Dr. Sarah Hanly, and Director Gabriela Escobar are working with district and school staff to complete funding for the individual grant projects.
- Arab Heritage Month is being led by Mr. Danja and his Arabic classes. Students will be performing and making decorations; Arabic music will be played each week.
- LT students will partner with the HANA center and The Period Collective to create pouches that will be distributed to low income communities and the homeless population.
- EmpowersHER students will work on skills that will help them develop positive self esteem, create and identify positive relationships, hone effective and positive communication skills with a focus on female empowerment.
- LTAC English and Social Science courses will include cross-curricular units in human rights.
- Social Worker Laura. McLaughlin-Kantowicz is collaborating with OSEL & Office of Student Safety staff for speakers to present to staff and students regarding social and emotional wellness.
- New Weight Room (Room 140) is operational to allow for more access and time for all sports
- New PE "Champion of the Month" celebrated through our Strength and Conditioning and Tournament Competition classes. Students are selected by their strong work ethic, add value to community and culture, supportive of students in the class, and positive influence on their peers
- The Director of Culture and Climate is currently leading second semester culture and climate student focus groups.
- The Director of Culture and Climate collaborates with student leaders and staff to develop student advisory lessons center on cultural awareness, diversity, and acceptance.
- Student leader athletes collaborate to produce weekly IHSA communication for the Lane community.
- Our leaders continue to prepare professional learning that centers around building relationships and community through equitable differentiation.
- Student voice committees meet once per month with administration or leadership team members to share thoughts and seek solutions.
