Ben Wong and Edwina Thompson thanked the candidates, and noted they were all extremely impressive and qualified. It was a very difficult decision for the LSC to select just one person to fill the vacancy. The candidates not selected were encouraged to run for election this spring.

## 10. Reports:

<u>Principal</u> - Edwina Thompson (See attached). Ms. Thompson shared that Phase 1 of the parking lot renovation (driver's ed range) is almost complete. Phase 2 (larger lot) will begin next year. Phase 1 of the HVAC renovation is underway, and new gym bleachers will be installed this month. Ms. Thompson informed the LSC that CPS has revised the principal evaluation criteria and process. She shared the new evaluation form. CPS will be providing LSC training regarding the new evaluation criteria/process. Finally, Ms. Thompson informed the LSC that student enrollment is currently higher than planned (4,519 students vs. 4,488). Lane will receive funding for each additional student in attendance on the 20th school day. The LSC discussed enrollment trends and numbers. Ms. Thompson said the goal is 4,450 students in the building.

**CIWP** - Edwina Thompson. Ms. Thompson presented the draft CIWP to the LSC for its consideration. There are three priorities: (1) Curriculum and Instruction; (2) Post Secondary Success; and (3) Connectedness and Wellbeing. Regarding Curriculum and Instruction, the theme is differentiated instruction with attention to culturally responsive planning and teaching. The goal is to increase on-track data for all students, with emphasis on closing the achievement gap for African American and Latino students. Regarding Post Secondary Success, targeted outreach is intended to increase the percentage of Black and Hispanic males attending match/reach colleges. Finally, regarding Connectedness and Wellbeing, the focus is the provision of SEL (social emotional learning) curriculum and support to students to increase motivation and decrease chronic absenteeism. The LSC discussed the concept of chronic absenteeism and how it impacts students at Lane. CPS defines chronic absenteeism as 15 or more absences, regardless of whether they are excused.

**PPLC** - Rebecca Daly, Mario Nunez - The PPLC hosted a professional development speaker (Meg Carol, Saint Xavier University) who presented information regarding diverse learners and differentiation. The teachers gave very positive feedback. The PPLC is holding its election for committee members on September 8, 2023.

BAC - No Report.

Friends of Lane - Lisa Applebaum (FOL Vice-President) - Ms. Applebaum provided a report regarding current and upcoming Friends of Lane activities. The first meeting of the school year was held on September 5, 2023. It was a "Meet the Administration" event and Ms. Applebaum thanked Principal Thompson and all the administrators who attended. The homecoming dance is scheduled for October 14, 2023. Four FOL members are working with students and administrators to organize the dance (ticket sales are done through the school, not FOL). Homecoming spirit week is October 2-6, 2023. The Lane store will be open every day that week, and has new items. The FOL annual golf outing is scheduled for September 23, 2023 and the annual appeal will kick off soon. FOL is looking to fill one board member spot (responsible for business sponsorship) and one committee chair position (teacher grant committee). FOL will also be looking for volunteers for the Lane open house on November 4, 2023. The next monthly meeting will be held on October 3, 2023 and will be an off-site, social event.

#### **Student Reports**

- A. Student Council Sean Groh The student council has reviewed and met with administrators regarding the new attendance/demerit policy. They will be preparing a FAQ for students. Homecoming spirit week is October 2-6, the football game is October 6, 2023 and the dance is October 14, 2023. Student club days are September 20 and 21, 2023.
- B. Core/Omega Owen Frasor Students have been very excited about the new furniture (tables/chairs) outside the main office. It's a nice spot to eat and congregate. Students also have favorable reports regarding the new college software, SchoolLinks. Finally, the Foreign Language Department at Lane wants to promote and encourage students to participate in the Illinois Seal of Biliteracy program and/or CIEE foreign trips.

C. Alpha STEM - Divinefavour Osuji - Students in the Alpha STEM program have reported some stress related to science fair and overall workload, although the program has adjusted some requirements to be more accommodating to student needs. The Winter Science Fair will be held on December 7, 2023.

Alumni Association - Michelle Weiner - Ms. Weiner provided an alumni update. On May 26, 2023, the LTAA awarded \$272,600 in scholarships to 33 graduating seniors attending 23 different colleges. Cumulatively, the LTAA has awarded approximately \$2.8 million in scholarships over the years. The Lane Tech Vietnam Memorial was corrected/updated and rededicated on June 3, 2023. The LTAA had its first ever student intern during the summer of 2023, and it was a fantastic experience for all. Also during the summer, alumni donated over 2,500 items to the Student Food Pantry. LTAA will continue its support of the program during the school year. LTAA provided transportation for 16 students to attend the College That Change Lives fair in August 2023, and will also fund transportation for an Ohio colleges tour later in September. The LTAA Faculty Innovation Grants application opened this week. The LTAA intends to award \$25,000 in grants to teachers and staff for programs and materials. Finally, the LTAA is currently planning seven class reunions.
