8. Reports

A. Principal / "State of Lane" and monthly Principal's Report - See Attached

The purpose of the State of Lane is to inform the community of how well we are doing. There are metrics within our district and it measures how Lane faired. Those metrics point to why we did our CIWP goals the way we did. The CIWP was renewed this year, this is an off year therefore the LSC was given information ahead of time. Not to be redundant, the State of Lane is a Summary.

CPS Vision and Blueprint: Lane's priorities are aligned with the district: Curriculum and Instruction, Post-Secondary Success, and Connectedness and Well-Being. CPS conducts Listening Sessions for families. Principal Thompson said, that if the families of Lane were not able to participate, she is more than willing to be a conduit for ideas to CPS.

Progress Toward the Instructional Core: Launched an exploratory commission to revamp Lane's Vision and Mission to be more inclusive of where we are right now. Dr. Hanly will lead this collaborative process.

SY23 School Performance Data: Lane Tech has faired well in most metrics. We are in the 90th percentile in most metrics. A thank you to our College and Career coach. It is noted more analysis for the slight dip looks to be correlated to the increased enrolment for the 7th and 8th-grade classes. LT took in 30 additional students. In addition to SAT preps, SAT drop-in lunch sessions is an option. Looking at the data from Fall exams, targeting to support students not proficient. Ms. Hilderbrant leads that work. Lane teaches through the test and does not teach the test.

AP performance data: 82.92% pass with a 3 or higher is the highest pass rate in Lane's history.

CIWP SY24-26: Principal Thompson believes in an emphasis on social and emotional learning: recognizing the stress students felt as they worked through the college writing process. The staff needs to understand how the students feel during this process and how it parallels instructions for content and skills. Finances: Out-of-school-time funding (OTS) helps with tutoring, SEL, etc. supports students and staff initiatives (as well as salaries).

Discussion: Structures for Admission, projects to be mindful of the class such as LTAC seats, and approval for our final numbers. LT will take a class smaller than the current freshman and sophomore, but not as small as the current senior class. Should be 4600 students. We will see it level out within five years.

As for the admissions for Diverse Learners, the district determines the population threshold. This year LT has a 15% acceptance rate of our total numbers.

Respectfully Submitted, Ana Scales LSC Secretary November 1st is a stressful time for all students, parents, teachers, and staff. Students are trying to submit their Early Action college applications, while at the same time, balancing potential homework, work schedules, and other extracurriculars. At the same time, some teachers are submitting letters of recommendation for students, and counselors are submitting transcripts. Needless to say, stress levels increase, and mental health is decreasing around this time of the year. However, some students not being able to utilize portions of the school day to concentrate on college applications around the plane of the school day to overlooked at Lane Tech.

Students have expressed concerns that they have received very little to no teacher support around the November 1st deadline. Let me be clear, the people that went out and partied all four days of Halloween weekend cannot put up a solid defense for not being able to at least attempt to work on college applications. However, the overwhelming majority of students that were working on college applications throughout the weekend, working on their lunch periods, taking mental health days (which are supposed to be used to get away from things like college apps), and needed extra time during the school day have said that their teachers did not offer support for them to submit remaining applications.

Now, this isn't to say that all teachers haven't supported students. Some students have said that some teachers were "nice", and that teachers gave them multiple days in the week of November 1st to work on essays and submit applications. I am very thankful for my seven teachers that have allowed me to go to the College and Career Center to work on applications, but there are still a vast amount of students who didn't have those same opportunities.

For example, students have said that the homework load got heavier as we moved towards

November 1st, and that teachers continued to stack homework on them, not acknowledging the

fact that they still had college applications to work on. Some people had unit exams and multiple presentations the week of November 1st, so how are we supposed to balance all this, especially in the time crunch a good proportion of the students were in? With some seniors, the teachers didn't even acknowledge the college applications. Other students felt discouraged to ask their teachers to go to the CCC, after hearing their friends say they weren't allowed to.

What I am asking is that administration makes sure students are getting the support they need from their teachers during this very stressful time. I am not asking the administration to tell teachers to disregard any lesson plans they have, but allow the students to be prepped when important deadlines roll around. That way, when deadlines like November 15th and December 1st (other college application deadlines) come around, stress levels are kept to a minimum. With this, when a student has a visible need to get their application done with the assistance of counselors or the CCC coach, I ask that teachers allow them to visit the CCC. These students are very, very hardworking, but if we continue down this road, it's going to lead to increased stress levels, lack of motivation, and burnout.

Again, I have all the respect for the Lane Tech teachers. They check in with students, review their college essays, and can make the college application process a lot easier. For all the teachers, this isn't a personal attack, but this is me advocating for my peers to ensure senior year proceeds smoothly. I hope these types of conversations can set up increased support for students in the Class of '25, '26, and so on. Thank you, and I look forward to speaking with anyone that has any questions or concerns.





LSC REPORT 11.9.23





This does not include ps two 4-year ROTC scholarships students have received. One student's 4-year ROTC scholarship is worth \$274,000 (the other is unknown) As of 11/5, Lane has hosted 173 college representative visits. Representative visits will now slow until we host Take Charge Tuesday events again in the spring. At least 43.48% of seniors and 17.58% of juniors attended a rep visit this fall. We're in conversations with rep visits to host panel style rep visits next fall, which Erin believes may engage students better. As of 11/5 81,69% of Lane seniors have applied to at least one college and 68,54% of Lane seniors have applied to at least 3 colleges. 91.22% of Lane seniors with a 3.5+ UW GPA have applied to at least one college, 77.70% have applied to 3+ colleges. For our target groups, 93.33% of Black male PS seniors have applied to at least one college and 73.23% of Latino male seniors have applied to at least one college. 100.00% of Black males and 83.93% of our Hispanic males with 3.5* unweighted GPAs have applied to at least one college. Lane's new Mission and Vision staff committee has been formed and we are currently working on C&W questions that will be asked of students in their world language classes. We sent out a form for gratitude messages for students and staff to fill out if they want to send to C&W someone. Open House was held for LTAC and High School students on November 4, 2023. 5000+ guests attended. Small Groups rolling out in November for students flagged as needing extra support from our school wide Needs Assessment: Stress Solvers (9/10), Stress Solvers (11/12), Talking Through It (9-12), CSW Sound Mind & Bodies (9/10), Sound Mind & Bodies (11/12), and LTAC Lunch Bunch Official Wayfinder Intro for students in Advisory 11/8. Wayfinder is an online SEL resource for individual, classroom, and school wide SEL resources and activities. Students will engage in 2 C&W Wayfinder lessons via Advisory per month. Teachers are encouraged to use the material in class. Students can access different individualized SEL support activities as well.
