Budget Update. The school received funds due to the increased Fall Enrollment of \$179,361 (CPS adjustment detail of the Student Based Budget - SBB) determined on the 20th day for FY 23/24). These additional funds were used to help fully fund everything that was needed.

Therefore the bottom line for LT after CPS - 2023 SBB/SA (Supplemental Aid) funding allocation minus LT Personnel/Non-personnel Expenditures yield_\$485,676 - Remaining Funds.

\$229,809 - was used in addition to cover the cost of 8, Point 2 (.2) Positions and Lane/Educational changes.

\$50,000 - for the initial cost of Operations.

\$74,750 - to fund miscellaneous Special and Emotional Support Staff

\$131,118 - Remaining Funds after utilizing the \$485,676 - SBB/SA

\$306,315 from the Contingency Line Item and the \$179,361 fund for the increased Fall Enrollment have been allocated.

The LSC voted on the last budget toward the Contingency Line Amount (\$306,315). There were Education Changes and Eight - .2 Positions to fill, therefore LT Budget was negative for personnel by a total of \$229,809. The Point 2 positions are overtime for current teachers who agreed to take on an extra class (overtime) to keep class period size lower (28-29 students). The District funds four of these oversized classes. And now that we are past the 20th Day, LT can "ask" if the District (Boards that determine funding allocations) can cover .2 overtime positions which can add to our Contingency Funds. Personnel lines shift often. This money - is to use it or lose it.

Principal Thompson proposed that the remaining funds of \$131,118 be allocated for: \$65,559 - Building Operations, Classroom Furniture, and Ground Repairs \$65,559 - leave as Contingency Line for Personnel Expenses - Raises, Benefits (insurance), Lane Changes (unused portions for PPLC Instructional/Classroom programming/ support tools). Student Fees can be used only for programming.
