
#### LSC REPORT 12.14.23



SNOWBANK: Over 330 new items were purchased by alumni across the country and delivered to school for the free Winter Gear Pop Up Shop, which opened last week. The drive culminated on Giving Tuesday with an in-person drop off event where alumni met Ms. Escobar and Ms. Loving and heard about Culture & Climate initiatives. Throughout the coat drive, many alumni have shared that they could relate to today's students facing economic hardship, and that it was a privilege to be able to help now. FRITZ POLLARD FIELD: The LTAA is currently working with CPS Sports Administration to complete the Fritz Pollard Field project by underwriting the procurement and installation of signage for the Addison Street façade of the stadium.
