A. Principal (see attached)

AP exams are happening now. Shout out to our assessment coordinators Katie Gomez, and Allison Hiderbrant, and our staff, teachers, and counselors.

The District's Chief Operating Officer, Mr. Charles Mayfield, toured the building with Principal Thompson. She expressed LT's interest in securing funding for the phase 2 HVAC building project - the Cooling System. He looked at roof drains, ADA-accessible doors, the pool, locker rooms, the gyms, the auditorium, and the brick masonry. The parking lot project is set for the summer and will be completed before school begins. The 1st HVAC project will end this summer and LT can focus on these next ones. SCHOLARSHIPS: 469 applications were received for 40 scholarships totaling \$303,000. Awards will be announced on May 24th. Postsecondary Success

CPS COMMUNITY FEEDBACK SESSION: The LTAA attended the May 2nd Community Feedback Session for the CPS 5-Year Strategic Plan. Attendees voluntarily chose to participate in one of six groups: Black Student Success & Talent; Multillingual Pathways & Early Learning; Postsecondary Success & 21st Century Learning Environments; Funding Model & Tech Systems; Students with Disabilities; Inclusive & Collaborative School & Community.

We elected to participate in Funding Model & Tech Systems. Most participants were LSC Leaders and parents of students in Selective Enrollment schools. There was a big group from Decatur Elementary. Three questions were posed:



What district investments have been most impactful for your school?

What resources are most needed at your school that currently don't exist?

What is one question you still have about CPS budget or school?

The discussion quickly pivoted to the bias against non-neighborhood schools, lack of transparency in the budget process and methodology behind Opportunity Index Scoring, and the overall dissatisfaction with 2025 school budgets. The response from CPS Chief of Schools-Chambers was that every school was getting what they needed, and Chief Budget Officer-Sitkowski acknowledged that things weren't ideal, and this first year would inform future budgets. At the end of the evening, the Funding Model group went home completely disappointed, and CPS got to check off the community feedback box.



GOLFING FORE GRANTS: Please join us on August 15th at White Pines for a day of fun and purpose as we raise funds for the Faculty Innovation Grant Program. Since its inception, the program has awarded \$370,617.00 in assistance to teachers, coaches, and club sponsors for enhancements to their programs.

The Building Operations Director is finalizing scheduling for summer construction in collaboration with our Project Manager- Parking Lot and HVAC projects are in progress. Assistant Principals continue to conduct check-ins with each course team leader to reflect, **C&I** celebrate, and set goals for leadership work using the district's Distributed Leadership Framework. C&I Efficacy data for Champion Coaches is being put into a presentation to share with stakeholders The Vision for the MTSS Team is being revised and amended to improve systems for next school **C&I** year. -Approximately 6700 AP exams are being issued no later than May 17, 2024 and we have had a CSI smooth process.
